The CCSHA invites all Clydesdale Cross Sport Horse members to take part in our 2019 Annual Show. The CCSHA Annual Show is two fun filled days of celebrating the versatility and diversity of the Clydesdale Cross. Plaiting, jackets and feather are optional. Feel free to go all out in your turnout gear or bring your horse with mane, tail and feather flying.

This is a fantastic opportunity to get out and about with your Clydie Cross, so why not come along, join in the FUN and make a weekend of it! Catering will be available for most meals; and camping, yards and stabling are offered at very reasonable rates.

We will be hosting an Open Ring for the more experienced competitors amongst you, an Amateur Ring for those who are just starting out and a range of young stock classes. This year we have also added a fancy-dress class and a topsy ring for our junior members. It is a great time to show off your Clydie Crosses, introduce your babies to the show world and challenge your training skills in the long reining classes and versatility course.

You don't need to be an experienced show handler or rider to attend. This event is perfect for those starting out or getting back into the show scene. The atmosphere is relaxed, friendly and supportive and there will be plenty of help available on the day. If you need advice or assistance prior to the event (e.g. entries, equipment required, what to wear, how to present your horse, etc.), our CCHSA Team will be more than happy to support you.

Ribbons will be awarded to 6th place depending on the size/popularity of the class and special merit prizes will be awarded by Judges and Club officials. High Point Awards are calculated for each horse and rider combination and will be awarded at the end of each day, as well as at the end of the event.

Competitors **MUST** be current financial members (full or associate) of the CCSHA and horses **MUST** be registered in either the adult / permanent registers or recorded as foals. **You MUST supply a copy of your membership card and horse's registration certificate with your entries. Entries will not be accepted without the required proof.**

Entries are charged at \$5.00 per class or you can purchase a Show Pass. A facility fee of \$10 per horse applies to all competitors. Pairs and Topsy classes are free.

Show Passes entitle you to enter ONE (1) horse in an unlimited number of classes for a set fee.

RING DESCRIPTIONS

The following information is designed to assist you to select the most appropriate ring for you and your horse to compete in. We are lucky to have CCSHA members from extremely diverse backgrounds and with a wide range of experience, so we understand that competitors do not always fit perfectly into categories.

If you are square peg who is trying to squeeze into one of our round holes, we ask that you consider the fairest option and the one that provides you with the most potential to further your skills. For example: if you are on the border line of the Amateur and open groups, you may want to consider:

- Will I learn anything new?
- Will my horse learn anything new?
- Will my level of experience be similar to the other people in my ring?
- Will my horse's level of experience be similar to other horses in my ring?

A horse and competitor combination may compete in different rings on different days; however, they are not permitted to swap between the Open and Amateur Ring on the same day. For example: if you are an amateur when it comes to ridden events but you are quite very experienced showing in-hand, you can compete in the Open Ring for led classes and the Amateur Ring for ridden classes.

The CCSHA reserve the right to ask a competitor to move to an alternate ring if deemed necessary by the Judge and/or Event Officials

OPEN RING

- The Open Ring is suited for Show handlers and riders who have previous competition experience.
- Handlers / Riders in this category understand the turn-out requirements of the Show horse, know how to plait / braid and possess appropriate Show attire
- The aim of this ring is to create a friendly but competitive environment, where you can strut your stuff and show us what your horse is made of!
- Handlers / Riders with horses 3 years and under can choose to enter the Open Ring or the Young Stock Ring (not both)

AMATEUR RING

- The Amateur Ring is suited for Handlers / Riders who are new to the show scene and just beginning to understand the requirements of the showing their horse
- It is designed for those may be starting out, may not understand the turn-out requirements of the Show horse, may not know how to plait / braid or possess Show attire appropriate for the Open Ring.
- This ring is aimed to create a friendly and supportive environment, where you can compete against like-minded and similarly skilled Clydie Cross owners!
- Plaiting & Show attire are optional, however all handlers and horses must be presented in a clean, neat & tidy manner
- Handlers with horses 3 years and under can choose to enter the Amateur Ring or the Young Stock Ring (not both)

YOUNG STOCK CLASSES

- Clydesdale Crosses who are 3 years and under (determined at the 01.08.18) are permitted to enter Young Stock Classes
- Young Stock are also eligible to enter the Open / Amateur Rings but cannot swap between rings (i.e. you must choose to compete against Young Stock OR adult horses)
- Young stock are eligible to enter long reining classes provided they are 2 years of age and over
- Handlers of all levels of experience levels are welcome to participate in this Ring
- Young Stock Competitors are not eligible for the High Point Award
- Plaiting and Show attire are optional, however all handlers and horses must be presented in a clean, neat and tidy manner

GUIDELINES AND RULES FOR COMPETITORS

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Riders/Competitors **MUST** be current financial members of the CCSHA and horses **MUST** also be registered
- **CCSHA EVENTS ARE STRICTLY DOG-FREE ZONES. WE ASK THAT BOTH YOU AND YOUR SUPPORT CREW LEAVE YOUR PETS AT HOME. IF COMPETITORS OR SPECTATORS BRING ANY DOGS TO THE EVENT THEY WILL RESPECTFULLY BE ASKED TO TAKE THEM HOME**
- The Event Secretary will be available from 8am for purchasing of merchandise and collection of Show Passes and / or High Point Cards. Entries are NOT available on the day
- Catering will be provided during the Event
- First Aid representatives will be on hand over the weekend for any accidents or injuries that may occur
- A professional photographer will be present at the Event and competitors will be provided with the opportunity to purchase photographs directly from the supplier. CCSHA representatives will also be taking photographs on the day which may be displayed on the CCSHA Facebook page or website
- All horses competing at the Event are eligible to accumulate Performance Award Points. Please ensure that you bring your Performance Award form so the Event Secretary can sign it on the day
- All horses competing at the Event are eligible to accumulate Annual High Point Award Points. Please ensure that you bring your applicable cards so the Event Secretary can sign it on the day
- All horse owners are required to provide a Property Identification Code (PIC) relating to the property where the horse is kept. PICs are a new requirement for all properties housing livestock and is an initiative to help trace and prevent the spread of disease. If you do have not yet applied for your PIC please go to <http://agriculture.vic.gov.au/agriculture/farm-management/national-livestock-identification-system/property-identification-code/livestock-property-identification-codes>. Applications are free and can be done online
- In the case of adverse weather or any unforeseen circumstances, the Committee Reserve the right to alter the program and / or postpone or cancel the Event
- Entry fees are ONLY refundable in extenuating circumstances (e.g. injuries or illness). Competitors may apply for a refund in writing (secretary@ccsha.com) and MUST supply a medical or veterinary certificate to substantiate their claim. An administration fee of \$10 will be payable by riders / handlers applying for a refund

CAMPING AND ACCOMMODATION

- Stables and camping can be booked directly with the facility through Nominate (<https://www.nominate.com.au/EquestDn/Nominate.aspx>). In the "Interest" drop down box select "Other" and then select VIC. There may be more than one event scheduled for Tonimbuk Equestrian Centre so please search the list for "Stable booking Clydie Cross Show". Bookings will open on the 1st March.
- Powered camping sites are available at a cost of \$15 per night and non-powered camping sites are available at a cost of \$10 per night

STABLES

- Stables and camping can be booked directly with the facility through Nominate (<https://www.nominate.com.au/EquestDn/Nominate.aspx>). In the "Interest" drop down box select "Other" and then select VIC. There may be more than one event scheduled for Tonimbuk Equestrian Centre so please search the list for "Stable booking Clydie Cross Show". Bookings will open on the 1st March.
- Stable are available for \$25 per day (5pm until 5pm the next day). You must supply your own bedding, feed and water buckets and cleaning tools
- Under cover yards are available for \$20 per day (5pm until 5pm the next day). You must supply your own bedding, feed and water buckets and cleaning tools
- To ensure that we have enough stables and horses are housed safely, please pre-book your stables. Bookings are completed by the facility manager and cannot be arranged on the day of competition
- Members will be advised of their allocated stable numbers, prior to the event
- Power and water are located close by the stables for easy access
- Stable bedding is NOT provided and must be supplied by members. Straw is not permitted on site – shavings ONLY. Stables and yards have dirt floors so please take this into consideration when ordering your bedding
- Shavings, hay and feed orders can be delivered directly to site and arranged through Pakenham Produce (<http://www.pakenhamproduce.com.au/>). Phone (03) 59411844
- All stables must thoroughly cleaned before you leave. Please make sure your stable is returned to the same condition it looked like, when you arrived. If your stable is not left in an acceptable condition, you will be required to pay a cleaning fee of \$50

WASH BAYS

- For anyone wishing to wash their horses on the Friday or during the weekend, there are wash bays available
- Please respect the grounds and other members and don't leave a mess for others to clean up

COMPETITOR RELATED RULES

- All competitors compete at their own risk
- All competitors who are NOT current financial members of Equestrian Australia MUST sign the Waiver attached
- The Committee reserves the right to refuse entry to anyone that is suspected of being under the influence of Drugs or Alcohol
- The Judge's decision will be final and Judges must not be approached on the day of the show by competitors or their associates

- No exhibitor may show:
 - An exhibit bred by or leased from the judge or their family in the ring which the judge is officiating
 - An exhibit purchased from the judge or their family in the ring in which the judge is officiating, until after a period of 12 months
 - An exhibit in a class under the judge who has produced an animal for that exhibitor in the previous 12 months
- Once a class has commenced, no exhibit may leave the ring unless instructed to do so by the ring officials
- There is to be no change of handler / rider once the class has commenced, without the permission of the Judge
- All competitors must wear suitable footwear and clothing. No open toe shoes allowed
- Bad sportsmanship and bullying will not be tolerated by the CCSHA and may result in disciplinary action (e.g. being asked to leave the ring, disqualification from the event, cancellation of membership)
- All ridden competitors must wear helmets that meet the current EA Regulations (AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onward) provided they are SAI Global marked; ARB HS 2012 provided they are SAI Global marked; ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onward) provided they are SEI marked; SNELL E2001; PAS015 (1998 or 2011) provided they are BSI Kitemarked; VGI (01.040: 2014-12) with or without BSI Kitemark).
- Restraining harness on helmets must be secured and fastened at all times whilst mounted
- Competitors who fail to abide by these rules will be asked to leave the ring / event

Junior Competitors

- All competitors under the age of 16 years must wear approved helmets (AS/NZS 3838, EN1384, ASTN F1163) when participating in led and long reining classes
- All handlers under 10 years of age must be accompanied by an adult while in the ring
- All handlers between 10 and 13 years must have a supervising adult present at the side of the ring who is able to assist, should they need help / get into trouble
- The Committee Reserve the right to request direct parental / adult supervision should they deem it necessary

HORSE RELATED RULES

- All horse and rider / handler combinations will be allocated an individual number which needs to be clearly displayed on each day of the competition. Competitors will need to source their own number holder which may be attached to the bridle, saddle blanket, breast plate or worn on the rider / handler. If riders / handlers are competing more than one horse, they must ensure that they swap numbers as they swap mounts. To avoid confusion, we recommend that you display your number on your horse, rather than the rider / handler
- All ridden mounts must be bitted, no bitless bridles or halters will be allowed in the ridden classes. This is for insurance reasons
- No horses under the age of 3 years will be allowed to be ridden, however you are welcome to participate in the Young Stock and Long Rein classes
- Horses in long rein classes must be bitted and wear a roller. As such, horses under the age of 2 years are not permitted to participate. Winkers and collars are optional

Stallions

- Colts under 2 years of age are NOT permitted to be handled by those under the age of 16 years
- Stallions / colts 2 years & over, MUST be handled and ridden by a person over 18 years and over and must be bitted at all time while in the arena / ring
- Stallions should wear official green 'discs' at all times whilst at the venue. These discs are to be worn on both sides of head collars and bridles or on some part of the horse on both sides to identify to others that the horse is a stallion
- Colts / stallions must be under effective control AT ALL TIMES. Any colt / stallion that presents a danger to other horses or people, will be disqualified from the Event and may be asked to leave the premises
- All stallions must be suitably restrained while at floats. They may be double tied (with a suitable headstall, neck collar and 2 lead ropes), hobbled and tied up or contained in a stable
- Stallions must wear a headstall at all times when not bridled (i.e. when stabled). This ensures that your horse can easily be caught, should it escape

Young Stock

- Young Stock must be weaned and / or compete in the ring on their own. No Mares or other companions may enter the ring
- Plaiting is optional. Naturally presented young stock should be neat, clean and tidy
- All colts 2 years and over must be bitted (or chain) in the ring and handled by persons over 18 years of age
- Young Stock that are deemed to be risk to other exhibits or exhibitors will be asked to leave the arena and no refund on entries will be provided

Harness Competitors

- All horses must be bitted when driven in harness
- No horse is to be left harnessed into a cart and tied to a float / truck / tie up rail without being fully supervised and under control at all times
- No horse should be left unattended whilst harnessed into a cart even if they are fitted with knee hobbles or the wheel is tied off

HIGH POINT AWARD RULES

As a competitor in our Annual Show you will be eligible to take part in the CCSHA's High Point Award. Members accrue points on each day of competition and the highest point scorer on each day, as well as the highest scoring competitor overall will be awarded a beautiful garland, sash and embroidered rug. The runner up each day, as well as the overall runner up will also be awarded a sash and embroidered saddle cloth.

Please make yourself familiar with the following rules and if you have any questions please contact the Event Secretary.

- Horses and competitors entered in the Young Stock Classes are NOT eligible to participate in the High Point Award
- Long reining and versatility classes DO contribute toward an Open or Amateur competitor's points tally
- Pairs classes do NOT contribute toward an Open or Amateur competitor's points tally
- Harness classes do NOT contribute toward an Open or Amateur competitor's points tally
- While the program only permits Open and Amateur competitors to enter ONE class per section, if a person accidentally competed in more than one class, the SECOND class would NOT contribute toward their points tally

To help you record your High Point scores, all competitors will be issued with a score card for each day of competition. If you have not received it already, please pick up your High Point card from the Event Secretary's desk (prior to the first class), write your name and your horse's name on the front cover and record your placings against the classes you have entered.

All cards must be handed in to the Event Secretary, **no later than 15 minutes after the last class has concluded**. You are welcome to submit your card earlier in the day providing your classes have finished.

Once competitor's cards have been submitted, a panel consisting of a minimum of at least 1 General Committee Members and at least 1 Executive Committee Member will process every card. Points will be added to the cards according to the placings listed against each class, totals will be calculated and details checked by a minimum of one member of the panel.

1st = 4 points 2nd = 3 points 3rd = 2 points 4th = 1 points Champion = 2 points Reserve = 1 point

Once each competitor's total points has been added up, cards will be placed in number order and the horses/competitors with the **five highest scores** will be set aside. The top 5 horses will then be checked against the results sheets by the panel members. The panel members are NOT permitted to verify their own card or that of a family member. Once a competitor's card has been verified, each panel member will sign the card to confirm that it has been checked. Once all High Point cards have been verified, the High Point Award and the runner up will be presented.

At the end of Day 1, all competitors and their scores will be listed in order and available for members to view. We will also confirm which cards were verified by the panel.

High Point cards from Day 2 will be processed in the same manner as listed above, as will the cards belonging to those vying for the Overall High Point Award.

You are welcome to keep your High Point card as a memento once the weekend is over or you are leaving the event. If you are competing for the Overall High Point Award however, we ask that your card from Day 1 remains in the office until the conclusion of the Show. This allows the panel to verify your points should you make it into the top 5.

Only 1 competitor can be awarded the High Point or Runner Up High Point award. In the event that there is more than 1 competitor on equal points, a count back will take place according to the following criteria:

1. The person that has been awarded the most Champions will be declared the winner.
2. In the event that both competitors have been awarded an equal number of Champions, the person that has been awarded the most first place ribbons will be declared the winner.
3. In the event that both competitors have been awarded an equal number of first place ribbons, the person that has been awarded the most second place ribbons will be declared the winner (and so on until a winner is determined).
